


A young 10 year old girl came to the dinner table one night to find her family's special red plate at her usual seat. She smiled wide. This young girl had told her parents when she got home that she had received her first "B" in math, a subject with which she struggled. Her mom saw her grin and affirmed what she was thinking: "We are so proud of your hard work in math. Your persistence is paying off!" The young girl doesn't remember what they ate for dinner that night, but does remember eating off the special red plate to celebrate. This tradition continues in this family's household.
