Each winter as the year grows older, we each grow older, too. The chill sets in a little colder; the verities we knew seem shaken and untrue.—ELW 252 (Read the rest of the verses before worship or from your hymnal if you have one at home.)

The poetry of the above hymn speaks to a reality that many of us recognize. Of course, we each get older every year. That's a fact of life. The "verities" are the truths of life and I think sometimes change gets harder as we get older because we see things change that from our perspective have always been and it can feel as if truth is changing. I think this happens most often when we place things at the center that really aren't the center. As God's people, our identity in Christ is central. Christ's saving grace in our life is central. Jesus the Christ is the center.

I've been your pastor now for a little more than a half of a year. I've made changes. You've sung some new hymns, you've experienced some changes in the shape of worship, and if you worship at the late service, the words of the Lord's Prayer have changed. (The "new" Lord's Prayer is older than me and was printed first for Lutherans in the LBW or Green Hymnal back in 1978. You can check on page 71 in the LBW and the "new" Lord's Prayer was printed as the first option.) But, despite these changes, the center hasn't moved. The verities of our faith haven't changed even if we are experiencing some of these verities in a new way.

As I reflect on these months, I do have one regret, and that is that I haven't made as many visits as I had hoped. I value spending time with you and getting to know you but I'm also learning the habits and history of Ezekiel and I simply haven't had as much time as I thought I would have in my schedule. I do believe it will get better some with time but I'm not there yet. People often ask me if I'm settled in and what I tell people is that I have to go through the whole cycle once. It takes a year to see everything that takes place and work through Christmas and Easter and all the other events along the way. Once you've done it once, it gets a little easier. Then it's not all new coming at me.

I give thanks for the way that you have accepted me as your pastor. I give thanks for the way that you have embraced and prayed for my family in this transition. I also give thanks for this congregation and the work that it has been doing in this community for so long. I give thanks for your generosity in giving of your time, talent, and treasure. I look forward to the day when the mortgage is paid off. I enjoy blessing those who receive the gifts that we collect as they are sent out. You are a generous people and your generosity comes when you live in response to what Christ has first done for you. When we keep Christ in the center, we can do amazing things. Let's do amazing things in the New Year.

January 18-21, Marci and I are attending the ELCA Youth Ministry Network Conference in New Orleans.
